We are being told it is for selling honey and other items and I have noticed you do have a website for your farm for the public. If you are wanting to get the permits before the tax deferment is in place, then you will be required to have a predevelopment meeting, a site plan review meeting and then pay for all permits as commercial permits. If you decide to wait until you are considered a farm by the county, then you will not have to go thru all of these processes for your farm.

For your refernce, if you have one of the items listed on the attachment near the bottom, we can use those as well.
