No Septic System

Dear Mr. & Mrs. Lunsford:

You are illegally occupying a dwelling that does not have a septic system. On September 7, 2000, you filled out an application for a system and a permit was issued on September 26, 2000. As of this date the system has not been installed.

You are hereby notified that you are violating the Rules and Regulations adopted by the North Carolina Commission for Health Services in accordance with requirements of Article 11 Chapter 130-A-335 (a) Section .1961 of General Statues of North Carolina. Ground absorption sewage treatment and disposal systems shall be maintained at all times to prevent seepage or discharge of sewage or effluent to the surface of the ground or to surface waters.

Please be advised that any action you may take without calling our department for an operation permit does not absolve you of the responsibility for correcting this public health problem, according to health department standards. We need to inspect the septic system to make sure it was completed according to our improvement permit. The continuation of this violation may constitute a health hazard.
