

IN ALL ALIGNING MEMBERS. USE 2" MEMBER END DISTANCE.



WEBS

- 1) Repair Condition: 0-4-0 wide x 0-1-8 deep notch with a thickness of 0-1-8. Notch is 0-0-12 from the bottom edge to the center of the notch and is centered at 4-8-11 to the right of joint 6 on the top face.
- 2) Damage condition(s) located 4-8-11 to the right of joint 6 have not been repaired.
- 3) Unbalanced floor live loads have been considered for this design.
- 4) All plates are 3x6 MT20 unless otherwise indicated.
- 5) Plates checked for a plus or minus 1 degree rotation about its center.
- 6) Refer to girder(s) for truss to truss connections.
- 7) Recommend 2x6 strongbacks, on edge, spaced at 10-0-0 oc and fastened to each truss with 3-10d (0.131" X 3") nails. Strongbacks to be attached to walls at their outer ends or restrained by other means.
- 8) CAUTION, Do not erect truss backwards.

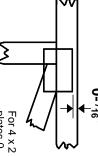

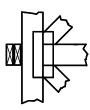

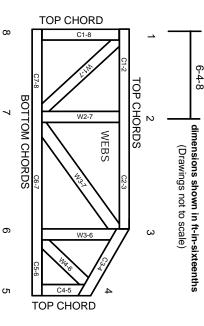
