



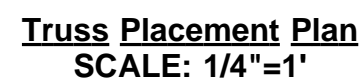
Bearing reactions less than or equal to 3000# are deemed to comply with the prescriptive Code requirements. The contractor shall refer to the attached Tables (derived from the prescriptive Code requirements) to determine the minimum foundation size and number of wood studs required to support reactions greater than 3000# but not greater than 15000#. A registered design professional shall be retained to design the support system for any reaction that exceeds those specified in the attached Tables. A registered design professional shall be retained to design the support system for all reactions that exceed 15000#.
